Responses from the Legislators Who Missed the Most Votes in 2014

(In alphabetical order)

"My wife gave birth to our third child, Victoria, in February. We experienced some complications with my wife's pregnancy causing me to miss votes during session."

"I was excused from the Washington State Senate to meet a request by the Oregon State House of Representatives House Transportation Committee Chair to testify on a bill related to the replacement of the Interstate 5 Bridge between Vancouver, WA and Portland, OR. Given that this project was the single most important means of spurring new jobs and economic growth in my district and region, I felt it was imperative that I speak for my constituents and our state before the Transportation Committee in Oregon."

"Regrettably, I had to miss some votes this session due to my new role as Senate Democratic leader. The session involved frequent leadership meetings with Senate Republicans, House leaders and the Governor's office, often called on an impromptu basis. As my caucus is not in control of scheduling floor time, sometimes I had to miss votes due to these other meetings."

"The reason I missed votes was due to budget negotiations and family obligations."

"My father had a very serious liver surgery on February 14, which required me to be with him at the UW Medical Center. February 14 happened to be a heavy voting day, and all the votes I missed this session were missed on that day."

"Representative Hurst's missed votes this session were mainly due to the fact that his mother passed away the week before session started. He not only needed time to grieve, but also had to deal with the many responsibilities that come with the death of a parent. There was also one day during session when Highway 410 was closed, and Representative Hurst was house-bound until it opened."

"I had to leave Olympia a couple of nights this session to tend to some important family matters. As you can see from my previous voting record, I missed only 14 votes throughout the past 5 sessions since I've been in office. My family issues required my attention on two nights this year, but many bills went to the Floor those two evenings."
