Health Care Session

Affordable Care Act - The Road Ahead and Impact on Washington State

Thomas Miller – Thomas Miller is a Resident Fellow at American Enterprise Institute (AEI), an independent think tank committed to expanding liberty, increasing individual opportunity and strengthening free enterprise based in Washington, D.C.; and a former senior health economist for the Joint Economic Committee (JEC). He studies health care policy and regulation. A former trial attorney, journalist, and sports broadcaster, Mr. Miller is the co-author of *Why ObamaCare Is Wrong For America* and heads AEI's "Beyond Repeal & Replace" health reform project. He has testified before Congress on issues including the uninsured, health care costs, Medicare prescription drug benefits, health insurance tax credits, genetic information, Social Security, and federal reinsurance of catastrophic events.

Education Session

Focus on Washington's New Charter Schools

Dr. Shelley Redinger – Dr. Shelley Redinger joined Spokane Public Schools as superintendent in the summer of 2012, returning to the community where she was born. She received her B.A. and M. Ed. from Washington State University and her M. Ed. and Ph.D. in Educational Administration from the University of South Carolina. Dr. Redinger's past experience includes superintendent of Spotsylvania School District in Fredericksburg, Va.; superintendent of Oregon Trail School District in Sandy, Ore.; executive director of Teaching and Learning for Richland School District and principal of Sacajawea Elementary in Richland, Wash.

Cindi Williams – Cindi Williams is a member of the Washington State Charter School Commission. She spent four years at the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, where she directed communications and external affairs for its investments in education, public libraries, and family homelessness, while also serving on the Foundation’s Leadership Team. Williams has worked in a variety of policy and communications roles, serving as Senior Advisor to the U.S. Secretary of Education – where she focused on reauthorization of No Child Left Behind – along with serving as Deputy Assistant Secretary of Education for Communications and Outreach.

Transportation Session

Importance of Infrastructure and Making Congestion Relief a Top Priority

Dr. Ronald D. Utt – Ronald D. Utt, Ph.D., is the Herbert and Joyce Morgan Senior Research Fellow in the Thomas A. Roe Institute for Economic Policy Studies at The Heritage Foundation. Utt is a veteran of budgetary politics in Washington, having served as director of the housing finance division at the Department of Housing and Urban Development, and senior economist at the Office of Management and Budget in the early 1970’s. In 1977, he became director of economic research at the National Association of Real Estate Investment Trusts. From 1980-87, he served as associate chief economist of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

Sen. Doug Ericksen – Doug Ericksen has been bringing hometown values and solutions to Olympia since 1998. After serving six terms in the House, he was elected to the Senate in 2010. Senator Ericksen represents the 42nd District, consisting of the Northwest corner of the state. Senator Ericksen chairs the Senate Energy, Environment and Telecommunications Committee. He also serves on the Health Care, Transportation and Rules Committees. His legislative priorities include providing solutions to keep energy prices low, create jobs and enhance our quality of life.

Government Reform Session

Opportunities for Sustainable Budgeting and Open Government

Leonard Gilroy – Leonard Gilroy is the Director of Government Reform at Reason Foundation, a nonprofit think tank advancing free minds and free markets. Gilroy has a diversified background in policy research and implementation, with particular emphases on public-private partnerships, competition, government efficiency, transparency, accountability, and government performance. Gilroy has worked closely with legislators and elected officials in several other states and local governments in efforts to design and implement market-based policy approaches, improve government performance, enhance accountability in government programs, and reduce government spending.

In 1999, the Municipal League of King County awarded Sonntag the Warren G. Magnuson Award and he received WPC's Champion of Freedom Award in 2010.

Environment Session

Consequences of Trendy Environmentalism and the Promise of Free-Market Solutions

Dr. Steven Sexton – Dr. Steven Sexton is an assistant professor of agricultural and resource economics at North Carolina State University, where he teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in environmental economics. With a Ph.D. from the University of California, Berkeley, Dr. Sexton applies microeconomic theory and employs modern empirical methods to address questions related to sustainability challenges at the intersection of agriculture, energy, and the environment. His research has appeared in leading field journals and popular press around the world including *Environmental Resource Economics* and *Agricultural and Resource Economics Update*, and he is a regular contributor to the popular Freakonomics blog

Dr. Fruits has been engaged by private and public sector clients, including state and local governments, to evaluate the economic and fiscal impacts of business activities and government policies. His economic analysis has been widely cited and has been published in *The Economist*, the *Wall Street Journal*, and *USA Today*.
