Affordable Care Act - The Road Ahead and Impact on Washington State

He has testified before Congress on issues including the uninsured, health care costs, Medicare prescription drug benefits, health insurance tax credits, genetic information, Social Security, and federal reinsurance of catastrophic events.

Focus on Washington's New Charter Schools

Anton Kramer – Anton Kramer is the Principal at St. Therese Catholic Academy in Seattle, the first Blended Learning Catholic school in the Pacific Northwest. He has years of classroom experience in both the Edmonds and Kent School Districts. Mr. Kramer began teaching in math classes for struggling learners and grew to work with students with all range of abilities. Transportation Session

Importance of Infrastructure and Making Congestion Relief a Top Priority

Dr. Ronald D. Utt – Ronald D. Utt, Ph.D., is the Herbert and Joyce Morgan Senior Research Fellow in the Thomas A. Roe Institute for Economic Policy Studies at The Heritage Foundation. Utt is a veteran of budgetary politics in Washington, having served as director of the housing finance division at the Department of Housing and Urban Development, and senior economist at the Office of Management and Budget in the early 1970's. In 1977, he became director of economic research at the National Association of Real Estate Investment Trusts. From 1980-87, he served as associate chief economist of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

Sen. Doug Ericksen – Doug Ericksen has been bringing hometown values and solutions to Olympia since 1998. After serving six terms in the House, he was elected to the Senate in 2010. Senator Ericksen represents the 42nd District, consisting of the Northwest corner of the state. Senator Ericksen chairs the Senate Energy, Environment and Telecommunications Committee. He also serves on the Health Care, Transportation and Rules Committees. His legislative priorities include providing solutions to keep energy prices low, create jobs and enhance our quality of life.

Government Reform Session

Opportunities for Sustainable Budgeting and Open Government

Leonard Gilroy – Leonard Gilroy is the Director of Government Reform at Reason Foundation, a nonprofit think tank advancing free minds and free markets. Gilroy has a diversified background in policy research and implementation, with particular emphases on public-private partnerships, competition, government efficiency, transparency, accountability, and government performance. Gilroy has worked closely with legislators and elected officials in several other states and local governments in efforts to design and implement market-based policy approaches, improve government performance, enhance accountability in government programs, and reduce government spending.

Sen. Andy Hill – Andy Hill was elected to the Washington State Senate in 2010 to represent the 45th Legislative District, which includes Redmond, Woodinville, Kirkland, Sammamish and Duvall. In 2013, Hill was selected as the chief budget writer and negotiator in the Senate and was the architect and sponsor of the 2013-15 operating budget that invested an additional \$1 billion into K-12 education and held tuition rates flat at Washington's public universities and colleges. Hill serves as chairman of the Senate Ways and Means Committee and is a member of the Senate Early Learning and K-12 Education Committee. He also co-chairs the Quality Education Council and is a member of the Joint Select Committee on Education Accountability along with the Washington State Economic and Revenue Forecast Council.

Brian Sonntag – Brian Sonntag is the former State Auditor for Washington. Sonntag was first elected to public office in 1978 as Pierce County Clerk, working as the administrative officer for the Superior Courts. In 1986, he was elected to the office of Pierce County Auditor. Following the end of his second term, Sonntag was elected Washington State Auditor in 1992 and was re-elected every four years until 2008, when he received 70 percent of the vote; he did not seek re-election in 2012. In 1999, the Municipal League of King County awarded Sonntag the Warren G. Magnuson Award and he received WPC's Champion of Freedom Award in 2010.

Environment Session

Consequences of Trendy Environmentalism and the Promise of Free-Market Solutions

Dr. Steven Sexton – Dr. Steven Sexton is an assistant professor of agricultural and resource economics at North Carolina State University, where he teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in environmental economics. With a Ph.D. from the University of California, Berkeley, Dr. Sexton applies microeconomic theory and employs modern empirical methods to address questions related to sustainability challenges at the intersection of agriculture, energy, and the environment. His research has appeared in leading field journals and popular press around the world including *Environmental Resource Economics* and *Agricultural and Resource Economics* Update, and he is a regular contributor to the popular Freakonomics blog

Small Business Session

Is Right to Work Right for Washington State?

Sen. Michael Baumgartner – Michael Baumgartner represents the 6th District in Spokane. He is the Vice-Chair of the Senate Ways and Means Committee, and also serves on the Senate Higher Education and Trade and Economic Development Committees. In his first year in office, Michael reached across the aisle to help write a bi-partisan budget and sponsored major legislation that was signed into law concerning regulatory reform to reduce costs for small business and a major reform to consolidate government agencies and allow for more contracting-out of non-essential government information technology services. Governor Christine Gregoire called his reform bill the "most significant transformation of state government in 20 years."

Scott Hamilton – Scott Hamilton is the managing director of Leeham Co., which was formed in 1999 following the sale of the company he co-founded, co-owned and co-managed, Linkraven Ltd. Leeham Co. provides consulting services to the aerospace industry, including identifying business trends and opportunities, competitive intelligence and through Twelves Unlimited, company branding and marketing. Linkraven Ltd., founded in 1989, published the internationally-distributed Commercial Aviation Report and Commercial Aviation Value Report; and organized conferences in Asia, Europe and the Americas under the Commercial Aviation Events banner.

Dr. Eric Fruits – Eric Fruits, Ph.D. is President of Economics International Corp., an Oregon based consulting firm specializing in economics, finance, and statistics. He has taught at Indiana University, the University of Southern California, and the Claremont Colleges. He currently is an adjunct professor of economics at Portland State University. Dr. Fruits has been engaged by private and public sector clients, including state and local governments, to evaluate the economic and fiscal impacts of business activities and government policies. His economic analysis has been widely cited and has been published in *The Economist*, the *Wall Street Journal*, and *USA Today*.
