Despite recent large increases in spending, public school officials are not providing children with the high-quality education they promised.

- 1. Number of students: 11,283
- 2. Number of schools: 18
- 3. Spending per student: \$15,800¹
- 4. Spending on teacher pay:

Average teacher gets \$122,200 in pay and benefits.

Teachers can make up to \$134,000 in pay and benefits.

5. Spending on central office staff:

Superintendent gets \$239,100 in salary, plus \$57,200 in benefits.

Number of administrators paid over \$100,000 a year: 60.

Only 51 percent of employees are teachers.

Spending growth: 6.


Per-student spending has increased by \$4,900, or 45 percent, in six years.
