

## Lake Stevens School District

Despite recent large increases in spending, public school officials are not providing children with the high-quality education they promised.

- 1. Number of students: 8,856
- 2. Number of schools: 14
- 3. Spending per student: \$15,800<sup>1</sup>
- 4. Spending on teacher pay:

Average teacher gets \$126,900in pay and benefits.

Teachers can make up to \$137,000 in pay and benefits.

## 5. Spending on central office staff:

Superintendent gets \$308,800 in salary, plus \$67,500 in benefits.

Number of administrators paid over \$100,000 a year: 40.

Only 51 percent of employees are teachers.


## 6. Spending growth:

Per-student spending has increased by \$5,900, or 59 percent, in six years.

## 7. Student learning<sup>2</sup>

2018-19:

- 30.5 percent of students fail to meet state standard in English
- 43.9 percent of students fail to meet state standard in math
